Column #16. SIMPLEST TELEPHONE TRICK

When I call a friend and suggest we do a card trick over the telephone, I know that I am arranging a truly baffling experience for him. Because few people expect a trick over the telephone to work, there is an added element of shock & awe to the trick.

This telephone trick converts the Moving Chosen Card trick described in my previous column (Column

#15) into the Simplest Telephone Trick.

## THE ILLUSION

I call a friend of mine and suggest he do a card trick over the phone with my guidance. I ask him to shuffle a deck, pick a card from it (now his Chosen card), memorize it, and place it face-down on the table, I then request that he deal cards from the top of the deck face-down to form two tidy piles with 10 cards each.

I ask him to place one pile on the bottom of the deck, place the other on top of his Chosen card on the table, and then put that pile on top of the deck. (Note: The Chosen card now rests 11th from the top of the deck.)

I then suggest that he deal 15 cards from the deck face-down in a tidy pile on the table, and place these dealt cards back on top of the deck. (Note: This reverses the order of the cards so the Chosen card is now fifth from the top.)

I finally ask him to deal the cards from the top of the deck and call out the cards as he deals them. After he calls out about ten to 15 cards, to his amazement I tell him his Chosen card.

## THE SECRET

How did I know the Chosen card? The secret should be obvious. The Chosen card was the fifth card in the sequence. When he called out the fifth card, I merely jotted it down and told him what it was after he dealt 10-15 cards so he wouldn't get suspicious.

Telephone tricks like these make for startling tricks. I included some in my book: Family Magic I & II. Look at them and create your own tricks. Click here to order my book from Amazon.com.

Telephone tricks are fun to do and amazing to the person at the other end of the line. This one has a great advantage of being so simple to do. Because it is so simple, it may be easy for your friend to figure out, so do not repeat it with the same person and develop a mystifying patter to go with it.

3-21. A stage mentalism routine that has become my favourite opener. It gets the whole room involved, gets huge laughs and yet ends on a very strong mystery. In essence it's just an elaborate prediction trick, but it has plenty of strong entertainment value. You'll also learn a new way to handle a familiar 'tool of the trade'. Peter Samelson said this routine was 'perfect'.

The Rowland Peek. A utility card move. Someone looks at a card. They are sure I could not possibly know which card they looked at - yet I do know. This move contains a beautiful moment of perfect misdirection that has been very well-received at lectures (I've even had people 'ooh' and 'aaah' when they see how well it works). I've used this move thousands of times all over the world - never fails! Michael Chaut and Etienne Pradier both said it fooled them completely!

Thought Extraction. My favourite card routine using the above Peek move. Perform this routine and even experts will conclude you really can deduce thoughts just by observing 'cues' and 'tells' in someone's responses. I was hired to train FBI agents last year, and this is one of the demonstrations I used during the breaks. It completely fooled them.

Troika Twist. A cabaret/stage mentalism routine themed around triple coincidence. One spectator successfully attempts to telepathically influence another. Not only do their thoughts match, in a way that is baffling and surprising to them both, but my prediction also matches... even though it is perfectly blank!

Flexi Force. A provocative and emotionally charged stage mentalism routine themed around the timelessness of love. At every lecture, this fools virtually everyone present and has them demanding to know the method! (Laymen love it too.) If you get nothing else out this item, at least you'll have a delightful way to get a spectator to force an item on himself without realising it.

CTS (Corner Turnover Switch). A utility card move, being my favourite way to switch one card for another even under close-up, ultra-tight conditions. It's also one of my favourite ways to force a card while seemingly going out of my way to ensure a free, fair selection.

Something Inside. A card routine using the CTS move. Nothing special in terms of plot or method, but

learn the patter (full script provided) and you will have some very powerful magic at your disposal!  
This routine - especially the words - can actually change a person's life.

Mind Wave. A variation on 'B'Wave' that requires no gaffed cards and can look utterly miraculous.

Whose Thought. Good for close-up or even strolling mentalism. It's a variation on 'Pseudo Psychometry' that will be useful for anyone who likes to give quick personality readings. It also has the merit of introducing a bit of fun and colour into the proceedings.

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Brainwave for Dummies - From Issue# 96  
Rick Carruth

Can you pick up a deck of cards and perform a good magicians force? Good. I'm not going into how to perform it here, although you can go -HERE- and read all about it..

This is a little effect I developed some years back. I do not have a clue as to whether or not it's an original effect. It's original to me, and I have not seen anyone else perform it. So.. if you developed this effect before 2002, my apologies..

I call this " Brainwave for Dummies " because it produces the same general outcome as Brainwave without using a gaffed deck, and is virtually fool-proof if you follow the directions. Don't assume because it's 'almost' self-working that it's not a strong effect, because it is.. At the conclusion, the spectator is convinced that you could not have used sleight of hand, since all the choices were theirs...

All you need to perform this effect is a deck of cards, one card with a different colored back, and a piece of paper and pencil. Oh, and the ability to perform a good magicians choice. If you have these tools, you're ready.

Take the odd-backed card and replace the mate to it in the deck beforehand. Begin by taking the deck from the pack, FACE UP, and casually performing a few overhand shuffles. It's not important to keep the odd card on bottom. All that's important is that YOU remember the suit and value of the odd card.

Ask the spectator if they would like to cut the deck a couple of times as you lay the deck on the table face up.

Announce that you are about to make a startling prediction, using the powers you inherited from your grandmother-the-gypsy. Pick up the piece of paper, write on it, fold it up and lay it to one side.

Divide the deck into four stacks and lay them face up on the table. As you talk to the spectator, pick up each of the four stacks and very casually fan them to show that they are random and mixed. What you're REALLY doing is looking for the stack containing the odd-backed card.

Keeping track of the stack with the odd card, begin a magicians force. Don't be in a hurry to eliminate cards. Take your time and work your way down to the last few cards.

When you're down to the last two cards, ask the spectator to gently place one finger on one card. As soon as you see where their headed, announce that you will discard/keep that card and that it was entirely their choice. If they put their finger on the 'correct' card, push the other card out of the way, but not out of play. If they put their finger on the other card, casually push that card to one side and pull the 'correct' card into the center of focus..

It's now time to reveal your prediction. Have the spectator reach for your prediction, open it, and read it aloud. " I'm sorry, but I don't have a clue what card you chose.. I do know, using my great skill, that your card has a blue back..".

Take the card, and for the first time, show the audience that the card does, in fact, have a blue (or red) back. Announce that you were able to successfully predict this, despite the fact that you could not see the backs of the cards. The audience will think you're rather dull...

"Of course, predicting that this card has a blue back is not really special. After all, they all have blue backs.... or do they?"

Pick up the other card and flip it over to show that it has a red back. Now, pick up the deck and turn over several other cards to show that they too have red backs. Pick up the pace as you rapidly turn over all the cards to show nothing but red backed cards.

Turn to your spectator and graciously thank them for picking out the ONLY blue backed card in the deck...

Of course, it helps to have entertainment value added to this, or any other effect. With humor and good timing, you can create a very nice, very puzzling effect.

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FLIM-FLAM (and a Gamblers Ruse) - PDF effect/download  
Bob Farmer

Magician, inventor, and author Bob Farmer has quite the resume'. Tsunami, Mutanz, Bammo Card Walloper and Bammo Monte Monster are just a few of his contributions to magic. One of my personal favorites is the Pentacle Force. Bob has graciously given the Roadshow permission to share this PDF with its readers...

"There is an old gambling scam known by several names. Bill Simon called it, The College Bet, (MATHEMATICAL MAGIC, pp. 173-174); Darwin Ortiz used, The Court Card Cut Prop (GAMBLING SCAMS, pp. 235-237). The Mark shuffles his own deck and cuts it into three piles. The Hustler bets even money (\$1 for \$1) that a 5, 7 or 9 will be on top of one of the piles. Without going into the mathematics here, this is not an even-money bet: the Hustler will win 36 out of 52 times (i.e., about 70% of the time)."

"This works with any three values, as long as each value is different (e.g., 2, 3, 4 works as well as Ace, 10, 9). Note that the bet is that at least one of the three values (not suits, suit is never mentioned) will be on top of at least one of the piles. You are not betting that all three values will appear. This also works if the Mark shuffles the deck and simply deals three cards off the top - there is no magic in cutting the deck."

"Using this basic idea, I developed the Pentacle Force. Rather than use three different values, I decided to use five, and since they could be any five, I decided to use the five royal flush values, Ace, King, Queen, Jack and Ten."

Theres a wonderful story behind the success of Mark Victor Hansen and Jack Canfields Chicken Soup for the Soul books.

At first they had a very difficult time getting anyone to publish the book, and an equally hard time getting anybody to buy it. 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∴ Telekinesis Psychic Test

This is a simple online test inspired by those who claim to be able to influence coin tossing. The algorithm randomly generates zeroes and ones, instead of heads and tails, and test your ability to influence the outcome. The laws of mathematics dictate that over a period of time the number of zeroes and ones generated should average 50% apiece.

As the test proceeds over a period of time, the closer the averages will become to an even split. IF you have telekinetic abilities you should be able to influence the algorithm to generate a greater number of one number over the other.

I like this site, as there's nothing to sign up for or download... simply visit and run the test. There are several other online tests as well, including a Zener Card test, a Tarot Card reading, and ESP test, Sensitivity test, and Remote Viewing test..

My advise to you... don't visit this site unless you have time to kill... It's sort of addictive.
